- comes home on Mondays. Reading books come home everyday and the children are expected to read as part of their homework. Writing



There are many focus in writing in this term. We will be writing about images, 'a moment in time', report writing, researching and writing information in a project. We are continually practicing the many skills involved in becoming a good writer, I have seen a huge improvement in the children's choice of vocabulary in their writing.

Reading is an important part of the classroom program. We read daily, the children are grouped according to their ability and bring home books that are appropriate for their age. Please take time to read with your child daily, it is amazing how much progress they can make with regular practice. Ask your child questions about what they've read, get them to evaluate the story, telling an you what the main ideas of the text are.

Mathematics

The focus throughout this term will be on number knowledge and strategies, with an emphasis on; place value, addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Currently we are doing geometry in class, and are making 3D shapes and patterns. We will be revisiting time later this term to practise our ability to read and interpret clocks.

Physical Education

We do fitness activities daily, this includes; daily cross country running, 'Jump Jam' (wet days), skipping, running and relays. Please ensure that your child has the appropriate clothing and shoes for physical activity.
