
#### CLASS PET

## <u>Curriculum</u>

We will continue with our Music and Radio Study from last term and work closely with Bruce from Tairua Radio FM to record, critique and finally perform our shows 'on air'. The 2012 London Olympics is a 3 week global event that will include a cooperative inquiry on each Olympic even to gain a full understanding of what is involved for each sport. Students will also appreciate and share their knowledge by preparing an experiential peer teaching task on the Olympic sport they focus on.

Other areas of learning this term are:

Mathematics - ALGEBRA, MONEY AND PROBABILITY. Science - INSECT ANATOMY Health/Well being - CAMP SAFETY AND HYGIENE. Physical Education - HOCKEY, CROSS COUNTRY, ULTIMATE FRISBEE.

Visual Art - PAINTING LAND-SCAPES, INSECT ARTWORK IN-SPIRED BY RICHARD KILLEEN. Te Reo Maori - COMMON CON-VERSATION & PERSONAL MIHI

Year 6 have formed a school ukulele band and will attend formal music lessons every Friday. They will then make regular visits to Tairua Age Care to perform what they have learnt. Later in the term this group will also start an investigation on 'the lost art of handcrafts'.
